Data Collection

Definitions for breastfeeding data collection were taken out of draft and accepted by Health Information Standards Council of Alberta (HISCA).

Consultations held with RSHIP for integration of these definitions into data collection Meditech. Breastfeeding data collection in health zones will be phased in at different times throughout this year. (Former Palliser Region, Calgary and Edmonton are up and running; former DTHR and ECH will start this fall.)

Initial discussions have been held regarding suggested breastfeeding targets and reporting of collected data. Most recent meetings cancelled due to AHS restructuring.
